Guide to understanding math placements and majors

Your major determines which math courses you are likely (or required) to take; and it is important to understand your math placement in this context. If your math placement is high enough for the major you want, then you likely will never have to think about math placement again! If your math placement is less than what is required for your major, you will likely enroll in a Math Readiness course at SMC (Math 2 or Math 12).
